

Oral Presentation Guidelines

Each student will choose to do one of the following oral presentation options:

Costume Presentation

1. Students will orally present their report in front of the class.
2. Presentations must include a re-telling **or** reading of information in their written report. Students who choose to re-tell their report may use note cards during their presentations. Additional information not included in the written report may be included in the oral presentation.
3. Student will wear a costume that represents their subject. School uniform must be worn for the remainder of the day. Students' presentations will also include two props representing their subject's life, interests, accomplishments or skills. Students will explain what the props represent and why they were chosen.

Butcher Paper Portrait

1. Students will orally present their report in front of the class.
2. Presentations must include a re-telling **or** reading of information in their written report. Students who choose to re-tell their report may use note cards during their presentations. Additional information not included in the written report may be included in the oral presentation.
3. Students will draw a life-sized outline of THEMSELVES on butcher paper (available from the teacher upon request). Then, students will color in their outline to represent their subject, including appropriate clothing/uniforms/costumes from their subject's life.
4. Students may bring two props or add two additional illustrations or icons to their butcher paper to represent their subject's life, accomplishments or skills. Students will explain what the illustrations or icons represent and why they were chosen.

All students' presentations will be video taped
