Dear Student,

We would like to congratulate you on your outstanding academic performance. Based on your academic performance and character since the beginning of this school year, you are eligible to apply for membership in the Campbell Christian Junior High Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society. Membership in the NJHS is one of the highest honors that can be awarded to a student. This is an opportunity to be a part of a nationally recognized service organization and celebrate your academic accomplishments with like-minded individuals.

Here are some reasons to join the NJHS:

Meet New People: Joining any club provides a great opportunity for meeting new people, but joining an honor society allows you to meet other dedicated students who likely share your academic goals. Not only can honor societies help you form friendships, but they can also introduce you to people who can motivate you to perform at your best in all of your academic endeavors.

Improve Your Resume: Though a high GPA can speak for itself, joining an honor society can boost your academic resume even further. Schools often look for applicants who have shown involvement in extracurricular activities and community service, so joining an honor society helps bolster your appeal.

Receive Benefits: In exchange for a membership fee, many honor societies offer exclusive benefits to their members, including access to job banks, scholarships and study abroad opportunities. Many honor societies also offer lifetime membership, which often includes permanent access to job banks and other member benefits.

Network With Leaders: Networking with local, national and even international leaders can give you a measurable head start when you embark on your high school and college applications. While most colleges will offer job fairs and other networking opportunities to all students, honor societies often provide additional networking opportunities specifically for their members. By attending networking events held by honor societies, leaders and employers will instantly recognize that you are a dedicated student, even before they review your resume.

Celebrate Your Accomplishments: Having put forth the time and effort to earn a high GPA (3.6), why not recognize your own accomplishments by becoming an honor society member? Receiving your honor society acceptance letter and membership certificate should be a rewarding and memorable experience that you can fondly remember for years to come.

Our chapter strives to give practical meaning to the Society's standards of scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character. These five ideals are considered as the basis for your selection as well as a fundamental part of our chapter activities. The National Junior Honor Society strives to recognize the total student—one who excels in all these areas. No student is inducted simply because of a high academic average. Please note that though you are eligible to apply, you have not been accepted into the organization yet. Applications must be reviewed by the NJHS Faculty Council to determine acceptance of new members.

Expectations for membership: Every two quarters, members are required to complete 10 hours of service.

The chapter will plan service projects to meet the 10 service hours. Members are expected to participate in all service projects. Service projects will be selected and planned by the members. These projects may take place during school hours and outside of school hours, often including weekends. Hours will be given based upon time served at each event. *It is essential that all members participate in service projects and complete the number of hours required for service.*



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This is the first step in your application process to be inducted as a member of the National Junior Honor Society. **Pay careful attention to instructions and deadlines.** We have included a Candidate Selection Rubric on how you will be evaluated. To be considered for membership, you must complete the following:

- ❑ **Student Activity Information Form.** This form is two pages long and must be printed neatly in blue or black ink. We recommend that you make a copy of this form before you begin as you might make a mistake on the first try.
- ❑ **Two Letters of Recommendation.** These must each be a **one-page letter (250 words maximum)** from an adult in the community who knows you well. These letters cannot be written by a Campbell Christian School staff member or a family member. The letters must include the person's phone number and must be signed. When requesting your letters, we recommend you ask the individuals to evaluate you on the five traits of the NJHS: character, scholarship, leadership, service, and citizenship, and to provide examples of how you have demonstrated those characteristics.
- ❑ **Subjective Letter.** This letter must be typed by the student in business letter format. If you do not know what a business letter format is, please reach out to one of your teachers. This is a **one-page letter (250 words maximum)** in which you show how you currently represent the characteristics of the NJHS—character, scholarship, leadership, service, and citizenship—and how you can use these qualities to contribute to the overall success of the organization.
- ❑ **Teacher Evaluations/Teacher Signature Form.** You must have three teachers complete a teacher evaluation form. Please allow your teachers time to complete this evaluation by giving it to them as soon as possible. The last day to give evaluation forms to your teachers is **Friday, February 11, 2022.** Don't procrastinate! **Fill in any blanks on the forms before handing them out.** As you give each teacher your evaluation, ask him or her to sign and date the appropriate box on the Teacher Signature Form verifying that they've received it. Teachers will submit the recommendation forms directly to the chapter adviser, so you will **not** include them in the packet you turn in to us. **You will include the Teacher Signature Form in your packet.** An average of the three evaluation scores will determine your points earned for this category.

Keep all completed application materials in the envelopes you've received. You will turn in all your paperwork together. Your complete file is due to the School Office on or before **Wednesday, February 16, 2022.** **You will be given only one packet.** Should you lose your packet, electronic copies may be found on the Campbell Christian School's website (www.campbellchristian.org/academics/junior-high).

Make sure you follow all directions exactly and pay close attention to deadlines. **If you do not turn in all pieces by these dates, you will not be considered for membership.** We wish you success in this and all your endeavors.

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Campbell Christian Junior High National Junior Honor Society Candidate Packet (2021-2022)

If you are chosen to be inducted as a member of the Campbell Christian Junior High Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society, you must maintain the standards utilized for your selection. Please be aware that you:

- **Must maintain a cumulative, overall Junior High GPA 3.6 or above and have no failing final grades in any courses**
- Must have been enrolled for at least two quarters
- Must abide by the Chapter's bylaws noted on the Campbell Christian School website
- Demonstrate sound and effective leadership, admirable citizenship, and trustworthy character at Campbell Christian School and in the community
- Pay the annual chapter dues of \$25.00 by April 1st
- Must arrange for transportation and participate in the NJHS Chapter community service projects in the Santa Clara County area

Dismissal Procedures:

A student in the NJHS:

- May be dismissed from the chapter for failing to complete and to provide documentation of participation in required service hours
- May be placed on probation for disciplinary reasons as defined by the Campbell Christian Student Handbook
- May be placed on probation due to three unexcused absences from the NJHS meetings or service projects (*An excuse note must be provided to adviser for consideration within five days of absence*)
- May be dismissed from the chapter for committing any offense classified as worthy of suspension according to the Campbell Christian Student Handbook
- May be dismissed from the chapter due to any documented incident of cheating and/or plagiarism
- May be dismissed from the chapter by violating the Campbell Christian Schools Technology Acceptable Use Policy
- Will be dismissed from the chapter due to being expelled from school

Dismissal from the National Junior Honor Society is permanent, but may be appealed.
